What is Achievement & Integration?

- MN School Desegregation/Integration Rule, part 3535.0170, subpart 2
- Collaboration between a Racially Isolated District (Butterfield) and Adjoining Districts (MCW, Comfrey) to increase cross-district integration opportunities for students

<u>Goal 1A:</u> Martin County West Schools will increase math proficiency of students in grades 3-11 who qualify for free or reduced priced meals (FRP) in the following ways: from 37.1% proficient in 2022 to 55% proficient in 2026 as measured by the MCA math assessments.

Strategy: Math Content Coaches

Indicators of Progress:

1. MCA Math proficiency rate of 42%

Results:

1. Math: 42.3% proficient in 2024 Met

<u>Goal 1B:</u> Martin County West Schools will increase reading. proficiency of students in grades 3-11 who qualify for free or reduced priced meals (FRP) in the following ways: from 32.7% proficient in 2022 to 55% proficient in 2026 as measured by the MCA reading assessments.

<u>Strategy:</u> Reading Content Coaches

Indicators of Progress:

1. MCA Reading proficiency rate of 45.8%

Results:

1. Reading: 44.2% proficient in 2024 Not Met

<u>Goal 1C:</u> Martin County West Schools will increase science proficiency of students in grades 3-11 who qualify for free or reduced priced meals (FRP) in the following ways: from 18.8% proficient in 2022 to 40% proficient in 2026 as measured by the MCA science assessments.

Strategy: Science Content Coaches

Indicators of Progress:

1. MCA Science proficiency rate of 33.3%

Results:

1. Science: 25.4% proficient in 2024 Not Met

<u>Goal 2:</u> Martin County West Schools will increase participation in out of school time programs of students who qualify for free or reduced priced meals (FRP) from 22% of all participants in 2022 to 48% of all participants in 2026.

Strategy: Out of School Time Scholarships & Transportation

Indicators of Progress:

1. 30% of participants in out of school time programs will qualify for FRP

Results:

1. 14.3% of participants qualify for FRP Not Met

<u>Goal 3:</u> Martin County West Schools students in grades 7-12 who collaborate with students from Butterfield-Odin Schools on a project to enhance their respective school climate and culture will self-report increased confidence in their leadership skills from the baseline percentage established in 2024 to at least 55% by 2026.

Strategy: Inter-district student leadership program

Indicators of Progress:

- 1. Increased leadership skills
- 2. Increased comfort with others who are different
- 3. Increased report of welcoming school
- 4. Demographics of leadership team mirror those of school

<u>Goal 4:</u> Martin County West Schools will continue to offer the school-based teacher preparation class, Introduction to Education, for college credit and maintain enrollment of at least 7 students per year between 2023 and 2026.

Strategy: Introduction to Education class

Indicators of Progress:

1. Student enrollment of at least 7

Results:

1. Student enrollment of 2 Not Met

<u>Goal 5:</u> Martin County West Schools students' access to effective educators trained in equity literate practices will increase from 0% in 2023 to 100% in 2026.

Strategy: Equity Literacy for Staff

Indicators of Progress:

1. 25% of staff trained in equity literacy

Results:

1. 41% of staff trained Met
