Dear Maverick Families,

We're almost to that magical time of year: the beginning of a new school year. If you haven't started yet, it's about time to gather the school supplies, find out which school clothes still fit, and get bed, wake up, and meal times closer to the school year schedule. The later pages of this very newsletter will tell you what time to be ready to get the kids on the bus this year. Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year!

Not only has our staff been very busy this month getting ready for the new school year, we've also been working on plans for a few years into the future when the new school building is completed and ready for its first school year. As the plans for how the building will sit on the site and how the space inside the building will be configured are getting more refined and detailed, the timeline for all this is becoming more clear.

The bonds that voters approved in May were sold last week. That sale was very successful for the school district and all of us taxpayers. The winning bidder offered an interest rate of 3.6741% and over \$5 million in additional funds (called premium) that taxpayers do not have to pay back. These terms will save taxpayers almost \$200,000 each year for the 20 year term of the bonds. In addition, this lower than expected interest rate means taxpayers will pay almost \$4 million less in interest over the life of the bond. As I said above, the sale was

very successful for Martin County West Schools.

After talking with community members on the Core Design Team and the school district staff this summer, the architects and engineers are getting closer and closer to having the building plans to the first stage of approval called Schematic Design. We expect those to come before the school board sometime this fall. The plans will progress through the Design Development and Construction Documents phases throughout this coming winter. Bidding on all the different aspects of the project will happen in the spring of 2025. I expect to have a big celebration before the end of this school year to break ground on the project. That puts us on schedule to be opening the new building for its first school year in the fall of 2027. You can plan on us having another big celebration for that, too!

I wish you and your family the best as you enjoy this last weekend of summer and prepare for the new school year. We are so excited to have everyone back and look forward to seeing everyone to get this year off to a great start!

Fall Sports Eligibility - Fall sports eligibility is based on students' fourth quarter grades from '23-24 school year. Students need to pass all classes to be eligible to participate in fall sports. Students not meeting these requirements will miss ¼ of the regular season for the sport they participate in, their grades will be checked again at mid-quarter. Students with incompletes will remain ineligible until a passing grade is earned.

Student/Parent Handbook - Found HERE on the district website. The handbook provides information on school practices and expectations. Please look it over with your student! Common handbook violations are dress code, cell phone usage and attendance. Remember:

- Students come to school to learn, it is hard to learn when distracted from a cell phone or headphones/airpods. Students who choose to not follow cell phone & headphone/airpod expectations are subject to the following:
 - Staff confiscations for class period or remainder of the day.
 - Cell Phone Office Referrals:
 - #1 Office Referral Remains in office for the remainder of the day.
 - #2 Office Referral Repeat #1, Detention & parent contact.
 - #3 Office Referral Repeat #2, Parent picks up the device.
 - #4 Office Referral Repeat #3, Additional disciplinary action may be added.
- Students come to school to learn social practices and expectations that will apply to their future academic and employment futures. All institutions, academic and employment related have expectations for dress, technology usage and respect for others.
- Students can't learn if they are not here. Did you know that a student that is chronically absent is a risk for dropping out and students that drop out are at risk for being unemployed, having substance abuse issues, being teen parents and being involved with the law?

Please help us at school enforce these policies for the best outcome for student learning.

 whenever they are on a bus.
- Please have students ready 5 minutes before pickup time.
- Drivers will only wait 2 minutes for students at a stop

MARTIN COUNTY WEST SCHOOL BUS BEHAVIOR

Most behavior on the bus can be controlled by the bus driver. If a reprimand by the driver is not sufficient, the driver will contact the Safety Supervisor or if the behavior is serious in nature, substantially affects safety, or is persistent, the driver will contact the building principal. Each referral to the safety supervisor or building principal may result in one or more of the following:

- 1) Parent contact.
- 2) Assigned seats may be given to said student or all students.
- 3) Removal of riding privileges.
- 4) Legal action taken, State Safety Department contacted, and possible expulsion from school.

Continued behavior problems on the bus will extend the length of the loss of riding privileges.

Rules at the bus stop:

- a) Get to your bus stop five minutes before your scheduled pick up time. The school bus driver will not wait for late students.
- b) Respect the property of others while waiting at your bus stop.
- c) Keep your arms, legs and belongings to yourself.
- d) Use appropriate language.
- e) Stay away from the street, road or highway when waiting for the bus.
- f) Wait until the bus stops before approaching the bus.
- g) After getting off the bus, move away from the bus.
- h) If you must cross the street, always cross in front of the bus where the driver can see you. Wait for the driver to signal to you before crossing the street.
- i) No fighting, harassment, intimidation or horseplay.
- j) No use of alcohol, tobacco or drugs.

The following rules on the bus, in addition to other reasonable expectations of drivers, will be enforced:

- a) Immediately follow the directions of the driver.
- b) Sit in your seat facing forward.
- c) Talk quietly and use appropriate language.
- d) Keep all parts of your body inside the bus.
- e) Keep your arms, legs and belongings to yourself.
- f) No fighting, harassment, intimidation or horseplay.
- g) Do not throw any object.
- h) No use of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs.
- i) Do not bring any weapons or dangerous objects on the school bus.
- j) Do not damage the school bus students will pay for any damage to the bus.
- k) Students will not eat or drink on bus without bus driver permission.
- 1) No sunflower seeds will be allowed on buses.
- m) Students will not litter.
- n) Students will listen to driver in an emergency.
- o) Music on the bus will be at the discretion of the driver.
