Legal concerns and the complexities of school finance, including budgeting and taxation, require school board members to spend many hours in board training programs and personal study to enhance their understanding of these issues. Our deepest appreciation is extended to the dedicated men and women who make it possible for local citizens to participate in education in our community.

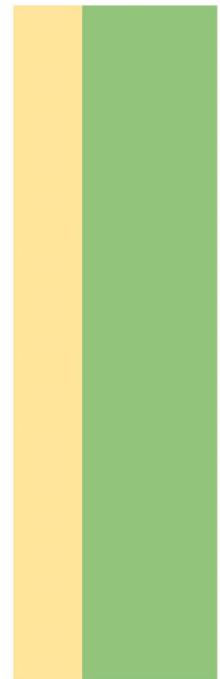

Martin County West Robotics

One of the fastest growing areas of employment is in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) fields. In order to provide students with an opportunity to receive hands-on experience in these areas, MCW started a Robotics Team for the 2022 season. The 2023 season is in full swing already!

What does a Robotics Team do?

The MCW Robotics team designs, builds, and programs a robot to compete in the FIRST Robotics Challenge. During this process students are learning not only how to build and program, but are also learning crucial problem solving and teamwork skills. We currently compete at one regional competition per year, the 10,000 Lakes Regional held in Minneapolis at the University of Minnesota William's Arena. As we grow, we would love to add more events to our calendar.

In addition to competing in FIRST Regional (and hopefully National) Competitions, this is a MSHSL (Minnesota State High School League) sponsored activity, so we have the opportunity to earn a spot at the state competition, and bring home a championship award for MCW.

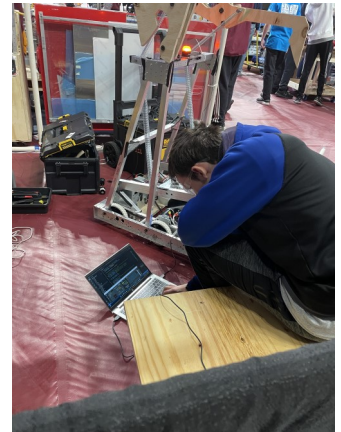
What is the FIRST Robotics Challenge?

FIRST, which stands for "For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology," is an organization with the mission of inspiring young people to be science and technology leaders and innovators through their programs.

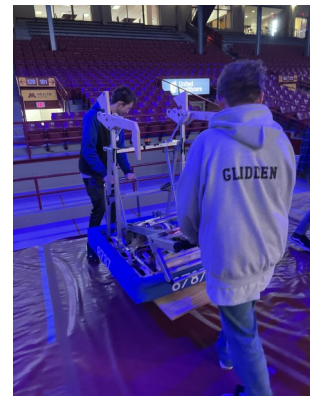
Each year, FIRST designs a game, and challenges teams across the world to build robots that can meet the tasks it provides. In 2022, some of the tasks our robot had to be able to do were: collect balls from either the ground or from human players, deposit them into a goal, and, at the end of the game, be able to hang on a bar structure without touching the ground.

Our 2023 Season

For the 2023, membership in the team has exploded from two students to a dozen. We are excited to be growing, however this has increased our need for community support. We are actively looking for monetary support to fund our registration, travel, and build costs. February is Nation Dental Health Month

All **1st Grade Students** will be educated on Oral Health/Hygiene during the month of February. Those that participate will come home with an oral health toolkit that will consist of: a toothbrush, floss, toothpaste, water bottle, timer, bag & calendar. This initiative is provided by Delta Dental through Smiles@School Program.



Parents: Help remind your children to brush their teeth two minutes each time, twice a day—for healthier teeth, fresh breath, fewer cavities, and to avoid painful dental problems. Offer a variety of foods from the five major food groups: fruits, vegetables, dairy, grains and meat/poultry/fish. A balanced diet helps keep your children's teeth and gums healthy. A diet high in natural or added sugars may place your child at extra risk for tooth decay. Habits begin at home!



The **Rethink Your Drink** campaign is a great way to teach kids about the amount of sugar that can be found in commonly consumed beverages, as well as their impact on health, especially dental health. Encouraging kids to rethink their drink challenges them to make healthy beverage choices and consume more water

MCW WILL BE OFFERING A FREE SCREENING OF “MY ASCENSION” DOCUMENTARY TO 6TH-12TH GRADE STUDENTS

The FFA and MCW social services department have partnered together to bring a showing of the documentary, *My Ascension*, to MCW students on February 24. *My Ascension* is a documentary about sixteen-year-old Emma Benoit’s attempted suicide, how she survived and how it propelled her on a mission to use her experience to help others find hope and stay alive. The film also highlights the stories of two other young people who, tragically, did not survive their attempts and the devastating effects suicide can have on families and communities.

This event is free and the community is welcome to attend an earlier FREE showing at the Sherburn Theater on Saturday, February 18 at 4:00pm. Due to the film’s subject matter, it is recommended that children under the age of 10 do not participate unless their parents have seen the film previously and are okay with their child viewing the content. Permission forms will be sent to students in grades 6-8.

Our hope is that the film and discussion afterwards will help bring awareness to students, staff, and families, and support mental health in our community. If you have questions about the event, please contact either of our school social workers.
