E Learning Days - What You Need to Know for 7-12 Students

- 1. Students must join Advisory on Google Classroom at 10am to be counted present for Advisory period. This is a short time to ask questions in order to be prepared for the day.
- Students must complete assigned assignments (provided via Google Classroom) for excused attendance for each class period. Assignments are due no later than <u>2 school days</u> following an eLearning day. After day two, student attendance will be finalized.
- Students unable to connect due to device or connection issues must have guardians email or call the office, preferably during the day of the eLearning event. Without guardian notification, the student's absence will be considered unexcused.
- 4. If and when possible, devices will be made available for students to check out (and return) prior to an eLearning day. Unfortunately, not all events are predictable. If your student is unable to connect and complete work due to a device issue on an eLearning day, please follow directions on #2 & #3 above.

Early Dismissal and Teacher Workshop Day - Students will be dismissed at 12:15 for shuttle buses and 12:30 for route buses on the January 24th early dismissal.

End of 2nd Quarter is January 24th - Report cards to be shared with families on January 31st.

<u>Course Selection for '25-26 School Year</u> – On January 28th, staff will be sharing information with students about next year's course offerings. Students will have access to the updated Course Catalog. Submission of course requests will be due on February 4th. Families should sign off on student course requests prior to students turning them in.

<u>Blood Drive</u> – An American Red Cross blood drive is scheduled for January 29th from 8a-2p. Sign up today with Mr. Neduzak by contacting the school. Student helpers are eligible for a Red Cross Scholarship if the appointment quota is met, so do two good things; give much needed blood and move our students closer to scholarship eligibility!

eLearning Days – In the event of severe weather that prevents us from getting safely to school, we will be utilizing eLearning days again this year. End of 2nd Quarter – Friday, January 24th marks the end of the second quarter. There will be a scheduled early dismissal that day. Report cards will go home the following Friday. If you have questions or concerns, be sure to reach out to your child's teacher.

Passive Consent Notice to Parents Martin County West Plan to Survey Students 2025 Minnesota Student Survey

Martin County West School District is asking students in grades (5, 8, 9, and 11) to participate in the 2025 Minnesota Student Survey (MSS). Federal law requires us to notify parents of this school activity. The MSS is conducted in schools across our state every three years.

Questions on the survey are about many topics relating to young people's lives. The survey asks about how well school is going, future plans, out-of-school activities, physical and mental health, relationships, substance use and more. High school students ONLY are asked about sexual behavior. This useful information about their thoughts and behaviors helps communities and schools develop effective programs and provide better services through provided state funding.

The survey is anonymous. To prevent individuals or families from being identified, students do not provide their names, student identification numbers or personal information.

The survey is voluntary. You may choose to have your child not take the survey by completing and returning the bottom portion of this form. Students may also decline to take any part of the survey or the whole survey while they are taking it. They are informed of that option by staff.
