School Closings and Late Starts

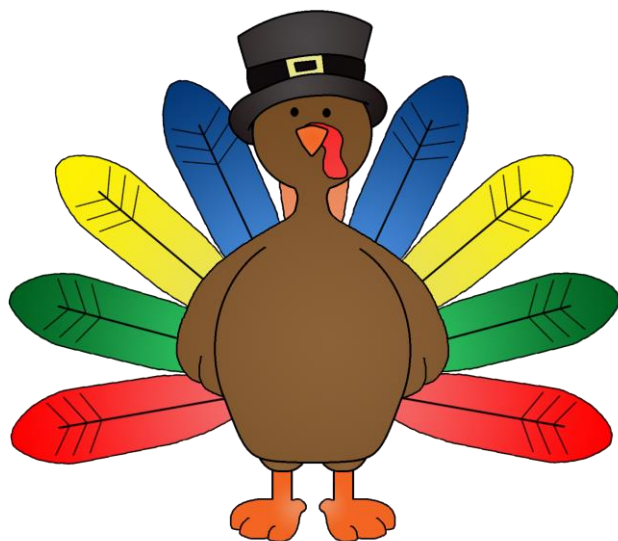
There will be days that school will be starting late and/or cancelled due to the weather conditions. We will use our **School Messenger** system along with calling the following radio/tv stations.

Veterans Day Program - Veterans day is November 11th, a day to honor military veterans of the United States Armed Forces. A program to be held at the Jr/Sr High School is being planned to be held in the gym at 9:00am.

Report Cards - Report cards will be sent home on November 11th for Quarter 1

7th & 8th Grade Interventions - Students' successes in junior high build a foundation for success in future high school years. Through classroom performances and monitoring of MCA and FastBridge assessments, students 8th grade have been identified that could benefit from some additional support in math and reading (guardians will be notified prior to students receiving services). This support will be delivered to students with instruction tailored to their needs. Students will receive interventions during a time when students use computerized software programs to practice skills taught in the classroom; no regular education class time will be missed. Mrs. Clarey and Mr. Rotunda will provide these interventions. There will be close progress monitoring to determine when each student has met their learning objectives. We believe that by providing small group instruction designed to meet individual needs we will be successful in helping all students show growth and perform at grade level in reading and math. The goal for the start of these interventions will be the first week of November.

Cheesecake Fundraiser - October 20th - November 3rd seniors will sell cheesecake cupcakes. These delicious treats will arrive in time for Thanksgiving festivities if you choose to support the fundraiser. The profits of this fundraiser are used to fund senior students' senior trip.

To keep students safe and protect them from unnecessary risk the following are some suggestions for parents:

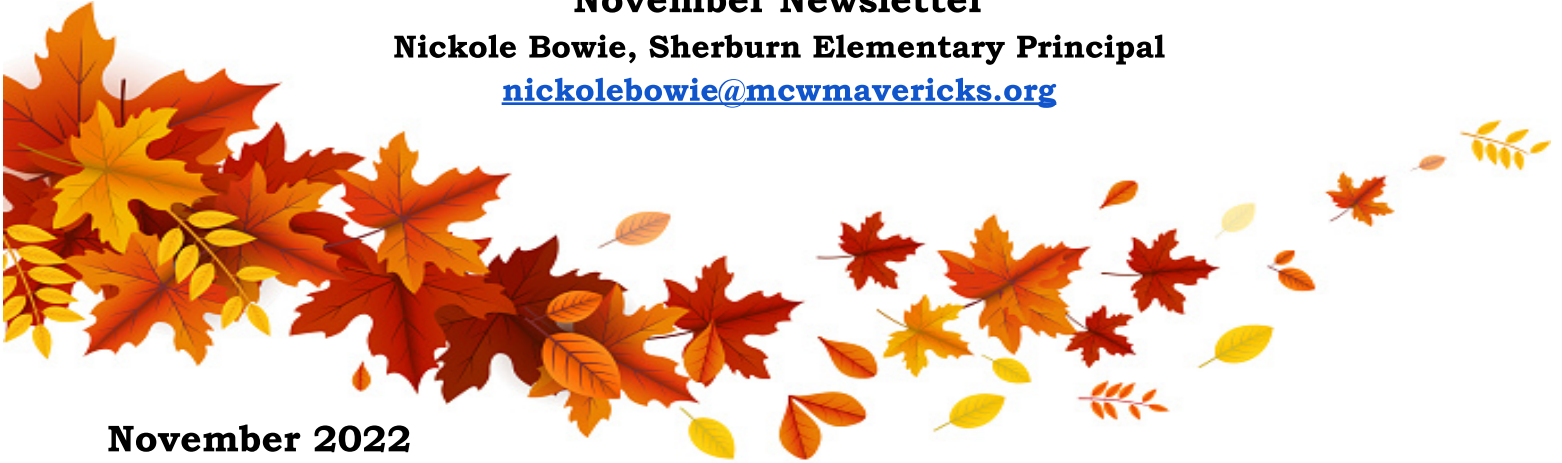
- ❖ Educate yourself about social media

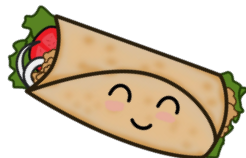

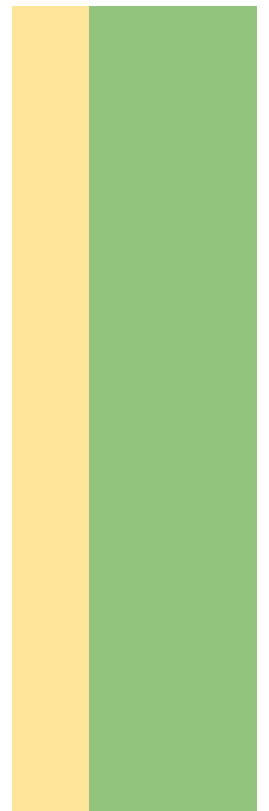
