*Fever over 100.4, has diarrhea, is vomiting, or has a cough that disrupts normal breathing or activities = stay home.

*Fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medicine, 24 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhea = come to school Hello MCW families, On November 8th, 1st Quarter of the school year will end! As students settle into the school year, they should be establishing their pace for the months ahead. While first-quarter grades do not determine the final semester grade, they serve as a foundation. Now is an ideal time to sit down with your student and have a conversation about how things are going—what's working well and what may need some attention. If this discussion raises concerns, remember that our Jr/Sr High School teachers are here to help! Parent-Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November 19th from 4 PM to 8 PM, but teachers are also available by email or phone. Don't hesitate to reach out yourself, or encourage your student to meet with teachers before or after school, or during available times throughout the day. Another great resource is Mr. Neduzak, our MCW Academic Dean, who is available for quick check-ins. We hope your conversation with your student is positive, but if not, know that there are supportive options, and both our teachers and Mr. Neduzak are here to provide additional help if needed.

We are excited to share that in grades K-6 we will continue using a program called *Character Strong*. This program teaches skills that will help students be successful in school and in life.

We believe that students should have safe, predictable places to learn where they feel included. Students should have healthy and helpful connections with teachers and classmates. They should also experience learning that will help them tackle challenges inside and outside of school.

Character Strong has three main goals for students: Be Kind, Be Strong, and Be Well.

- **Be Kind**: Social skills like listening, friendship, solving conflicts, and leadership. These skills are taught alongside *Empathy, Respect, & Cooperation*
- **Be Strong**: Skills that help students focus, stay organized, and set goals. These skills are taught alongside *Responsibility, Courage, & Perseverance*


