Dear Martin County West Families,

At their meeting on Monday, September 19, 2022, the school board approved a plan developed by teachers to offer e-learning days during the 2022-2023 school year. An e-learning day is an instructional day that takes place at home when weather conditions are too poor for school to be held in the buildings. This will help us continue student learning even when the weather does not cooperate and avoid having to make up days later in the school year.

The requirements for e-learning days are:

- They can only be used for inclement weather.
- There can be a maximum of five e-learning days in one school year.
- They are counted as instructional days and included as hours of instruction.
- The E-Learning Day Plan must be approved by the School Board. This occurred on September 19, 2022.
- Schools must make accommodations for internet connectivity issues.
- Teachers must provide accessible digital instruction for students with disabilities.
- Families must be notified annually at the beginning of the school year. This letter is the notification for the 2022-2023 school year.
- Families must be notified at least two hours before the school day begins.
- Students must have access to teachers via telephone and/or online during normal school hours.

The MCW E-Learning Days Plan can be found at <u>martin.k12.mn.us</u>. Over the next few weeks, teachers will be making plans for e-learning days specific to their classes this year. Teachers will have more information about e-learning day activities for your children at fall conferences.

In the event that an e-learning day is used, families will receive alerts via phone, text, and email. The notification will also be posted on each school's Facebook page. Please log into Infinite Campus to check that your contact information is updated, and call your children's school office to make any necessary changes.

Please plan to attend fall conferences to learn more about the teachers' plans for our trial run with e-learning days this year.

Attendance

Did you know that absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2–4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school. In addition, a student's attendance directly correlates with their ability to read proficiently (source Attendance Works). Please be an advocate for your students' school attendance; if students are healthy send them to school! When not possible due to illness, please be sure to let the office staff know that your child will be absent, needs to leave school early, or will be late to school. It is very important that we keep accurate records of attendance.



Bus Safety

Appropriate behavior on the bus is an important part of the school day for many of our students. The ride to and from school can have a big effect on a child's ability to focus during the school day. **Transportation to and from school is a privilege**, therefore students are expected to follow the behavioral expectations on the bus. These expectations are in place to ensure the safety of students while in transit and preserve a child's readiness to learn.

- Follow driver directions and obey all laws and safety rules for your bus
- Place trash in receptacles
- Use positive tone, volume and language while on the bus
- Stay in your seat facing forward **keeping hands & feet to self**
- Report suspicious/dangerous behavior and acts of bullying
- Be on Time



Winter Session is Tuesdays, February 14 to 28.



School Illness Reminders:

Now that we are gearing into October, we usually see an uptick in cases of Influenza, RSV, colds and pesky virus's (COVID). Please monitor your child's symptoms every morning.

Please keep your child home if:

- Fever > 100.4 Students must stay home if they have a fever. May return after 24 hours as long as fever is gone and <u>without</u> using fever reducing medication for 24 hours.
- Vomiting. Student must stay home 24 hours after last episode.
- COVID +. Students must stay home
 if they test positive for COVID.
 Students must stay home for 5 days
 of when symptoms first appeared
 or test date. Please see MDH
 guidelines here.

Free Covid Testing Supplies

Martin County West School District has a supply of BinaxNOW over the counter Covid-19 testing supplies for use by students, families, and staff. These testing supplies were provided through the Minnesota Department of Health and are intended to be used at home. Tests will be available upon request as long as supplies last.
